Giving Tuesday, Colorado Gives Day, Year End.. oh my!

Origins and explanations of end-of-year fundraising

Our most important fundraising period of the year is approaching. We know all the different fundraising days can be confusing, so we wanted to clear things up! You may be wondering if it is better to give on Colorado Gives Day, Giving Tuesday, or at Year End? The good news is that all of those options are great!

Colorado Gives Day: Colorado Gives Day originated in 2010 and has raised over \$415 million for charities in our state. In 2024, Colorado Gives Day is Tuesday, December 10th, but any gift made through our online Colorado Gives platform page (our donation page linked through our website) from November 1 through December 10, will be boosted by an Incentive Fund, made possible by Colorado Gives Foundation and FirstBank. Each nonprofit will receive a share of the fund based on how much they raise! Plus, if you set up a new monthly donation, Colorado Gives Foundation will match your first monthly gift up to \$100!

Giving Tuesday: Giving Tuesday is the first Tuesday after Thanksgiving. In 2024, Giving Tuesday is December 3rd. This day-of-generosity originated in 2012 in New York City, as a counter response to the consumerism and commercialism of Black Friday and Cyber Monday. Giving Tuesday has grown into a global movement, centered around this day of doing good.

Year End: "Year end" is generally considered to be anytime November through December. Although donations any day of the year are highly prized, giving during this time period helps us reach our critical fundraising goals! Getting those donations in by the end of the calendar year also means you may be able to claim them come tax season.

Bottom line? Your end-of-year generosity is appreciated on any day.
